Mindfulness Message from Success Club

As the holiday season approaches, here are three fun mindfulness activities you can do as a family:

1. Go on a "Mindful Holiday Walk," where you and your children can take a stroll to see the lights and decorations in your neighbourhood or take a walk in the park and notice how many, nests, dogs, people wearing glasses, gloves or anything that makes you focus and be present you can see. Encourage everyone to notice the colours, shapes, and sounds, and share what each person feels and sees

2. At home, you can create a "Gratitude Garland." Each day, family members write or draw something they're grateful for on a paper strip and link the strips together around your tree, table leg, or along a mantelpiece. This not only decorates your home but also cultivates a sense of gratitude and togetherness.

3. End each day with a "Family Reflection," where each person shares their favourite moment of the day.

These mindfulness practices can help create a calm, connected, and memorable holiday season for your family.
